Dr. Stan Toler is a dynamic international speaker, having spoken in nearly 80 countries of the world. He has written over 90 books. His books have sold over 3 million copies. Some of his best sellers include, *The Secret Blend; Richest Person in the World; Five Secrets of An Exceptional Leader; The Inspirational Speaker's Resource; ReThink Your Life* and his newest book, *Terrific! Five Star Customer Service.*

Toler has shared the platform with great speakers such as Zig Ziglar, Jerry Lucas, Rick Warren, Bill Hybels and baseball great R.A. Dickey. R.A. often says that Stan is the most prolific writer he has ever met. His best friend, John C. Maxwell, describes him as an engaging speaker who has a terrific sense of humor and the charm of a Southern storyteller.

Bringing a wealth of knowledge and candor, Dr. Toler will present concepts from his new book on customer service when he is the keynote presenter for Peer Learning Network Presents.

Toler for many years served as Vice-President and taught seminars for John C. Maxwell's INJOY Leadership Institute, training church and corporate leaders to make a difference in the world. In 2009, he was honored with a Doctor of Divinity degree by Southern Nazarene University.


