

Report on Women in Ministry in Nigeria



The fact that women have gained great respect in the ministry of Christian education gives us hope for what the future might hold for women in ministry here in Nigeria. Despite the uphill battle to break down the chains of patriarchy that bind many women, we have seen progress. The women at South East Church of the Nazarene are shaping the lives of the future generation through the ministry of Christian education. Women in Nigeria are at the forefront of building up a generation of innovative Nigerians who desire to serve Christ and serve others in all spheres of life. They held their annual district women's convention in 2022. The four-day gathering included fasting and prayer for missions and missionaries, outreach evangelism, hospital and prison visitations to pray for patients and inmates, worship ministry, Bible studies, and lectures on holiness and eschatological events. More than seven hundred women gathered for the convention. Twenty new women were given the right hand of fellowship and received into the church by the District Superintendent Rev. Eshiet. Thirty-four women gave their life to Jesus during the altar call. We praise God for what He has done in women's ministry in Nigeria.
