## **PRESIDENT**

President John Hibben of Princeton maintained that the object of Princeton education was to bring a man into full possession of his powers with a richly stored mind, a trustworthy character, a spirit of ambition based on attainment, and a spirit of consecration to devote that attainment to the welfare of the world. These appear to be worthy aims for Trevecca Nazarene College.

Christ came to make possible the abundant life. Trevecca takes the finest young men and women of the church and tries to assist them in attaining to the full heights of Christian manhood and womanhood and coming into the full possession of their powers.
