Editor's Note









This edition of the *Darda* is an opportunity to pause and take a look at who we, as Trevecca, claim to be. The name *Trevecca* means "house of Rebecca" or "a binding together in love." The name is derived from the word *Trevecka*, the name of a school, a castle, and a village in Wales. The school, established in 1768 by Lady Huntingdon, was an effort to "bring together" followers of John Calvin and John Wesley. Clearly, the ideas of unity, connectedness, and community are attributed to the word *Trevecca*. Those words describe who we are as Treveccans: we are a community, one body in Christ.

Trevecca's motto, *Esse Quam Videri*, means "to BE rather than to seem," and it is the theme of this edition of the *Darda*. The way I see it, we as individuals make up the community that we live in. The unity in the community comes from our union with Christ Jesus. Jesus commanded you and me, as individuals, to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment, and the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the law and the prophets hang on these two commandments" (Matthew 22:37-40). A community is created when we love our God, and love each other, and ourselves. Trevecca cannot be the community its name implies if we Treveccans do not have love.

Esse Quam Videri reminds us to strive to obey Jesus' commandment to love God and to love each other.

Let us **BE** a community of love rather than merely seeming to be one. Let us strive to love God and each other in our day-to-day lives so that we ensure that Trevecca is a community in which persons are bound together in love.




For the first time in its history, Trevecca broke the 1,000-student mark with a traditional undergraduate enrollment of 1,015.













What does Esse Quam Videri mean to you?

What I love about our university motto is that it is "Christian" at its very heart. It seeks to shape a community and individuals who are authentically who they say they are. The Christian journey is not about learning how to become an expert in masquerade; it is not self-deception or deception of friends and family. It is not simply learning what Jesus would do, but it is allowing the actions that we do to emerge out of who we are. It is honesty, genuineness, and authenticity so that the lives we live, the words that we say, and the commitments that we make are the overflow of who we are. *Esse Quam Videri* is the hope of Jeremiah lived out—the hope that God's instruction, Jesus' teaching, would not simply be written on a tablet that remains outside of us but rather written upon our hearts, our minds, so that the divine Word guides us, moves us, and forms us.



In the big picture of all that is planned for spiritual formation on campus, the Christian understanding of being Christian and not simply seeming Christian guides programs, worship services, and commitments. While our human tendency can always take what is provided and turn opportunities into one more way of seeming rather than being, the prayer and hope of Trevecca and of the chaplain's office is that every worship gathering, every MERGE group, every prayer opportunity, every spiritual deepening experience, and every ministry opportunity—both in our community and across the world—will act as a means of God's grace to shape us into being authentic, real, growing, and transformed disciples of Jesus Christ. As we participate in these experiences, from public worship to discipleship to acts of service, we dare to believe and hope that these are so much more than costumes to make us appear or seem Christian, but rather that through them the Holy Spirit will actually transform our minds and will form us into real, authentic followers of Jesus.

The primary goal for our campus is that together we will continue to grow into authentic, genuine disciples of Jesus Christ not by appearing to be Christian but by the transformation that only the Holy Spirit can make in our lives. While this goal includes the transformation of each and every individual, it extends into community transformation—the dream that we will not be multiple "Jesuses" on our campus but that together we will be the body of Christ. The Trevecca community is this kind of place: when one member suffers, we all suffer with him/her, and when one member celebrates, we all celebrate with him/her. It looks like a community that is not made up of a few "superheroes" who do great things for God, but rather an entire body that together is roaming our neighborhood, our city, and our world as the body of Christ broken and spilled out for the world. It looks like a safe place, a place where we are slow to judge and quick to forgive, where we hope for the best and are willing to be broken for each other. It looks like a refuge where masquerade and cover-up is unnecessary because healing and forgiveness are central to who we are. How do we get there? We participate together in the opportunities that the Lord provides to us—worship, discipleship, prayer, accountability, service—knowing that we cannot transform ourselves, but that the God who loves us and calls us to love him and to love our neighbor is able to do abundantly beyond what we could ever ask or imagine. We trust him as we partner with him and as we partner with our sisters and brothers.



Summer Mission Efforts



Spiritual Deepening Week



At the end of the 2012 spring semester, students participated in a survey about Christian life. Survey results indicated that 65% of the student body engaged in Christian accountability with another Christian that semester. Brent Tallman explained, "Students carry a lot with them that we cannot see in a classroom setting." Tallman's goal and vision for Merge groups is to "create an atmosphere where we realize our need for accountability and engage in it. A place where we can be real, vulnerable, and honest with one another." Brent Tallman also leads a Merge group that meets every Friday morning at 10 A.M. in the Center for Leadership, Calling, and Service. His 2013 spring semester Merge group studied *The Samaritan Project*, an exploration of what it means to be a neighbor.



On Trevecca's campus the term *Merge* is another name for a program that uses small groups to help students in their Christian discipleship. Ten to fifteen different Merge groups meet weekly on campus, at different times, in different places, and for similar interests. Some Merge groups are composed of students who share similar interests—athletics, women in ministry, social justice, and others. The time, place, and even main interest of the group are left up to the leader to decide. Brent Tallman, director of Campus Spiritual Formation at Trevecca said, "Students want to have accountability in their lives on their own terms." Tallman's approach to Merge groups is one that can be described as "hands-off" because he wants the students to realize their need for accountability. Tallman describes his role as "Providing resources and having tools available for students to lead their Merge group."







The Trevecca men's and women's cross country teams participated in the 2012 NCCAA Cross Country Championship at Cedarville University. The men finished in 23rd place, and the women finished in 25th place. The Trojans finished their season strong with several runners pushing their personal best times despite some nagging injuries and windy conditions. The 2012 team will go down as the best of the program's efforts since restarting the program three years ago because it turned in the best season performance in the three-year history of the program.

For the women's team, Katherine Carmody stepped up for her team and finished as its #2 runner even though a knee problem had kept her out of practice before the championship meet. Jaclyn Sendewicz had a personal best and finished the season as Trevecca's #1 runner. Rachel Mudd achieved another personal record. Morgan Dykes and Christina Corzine were very close to their personal records.



Men's soccer had 12 team members return and 10 new players, and the team finished with a winning season.

Men's soccer coach Danny Leavy assessed his team's 2012-2013 season: "This was the first year where all of the players on the team are the players that I recruited to the University. Team chemistry is obviously very important at the college level, but whenever there is competition, the priority is to win. Coaches at Trevecca have the flexibility to spend time building a team and helping our players develop character.

"The most important thing for players to understand is that they need to be fully aware of the opportunity that has been given to them. For me, I love it when they come to the realization that playing soccer at Trevecca is a huge privilege and a great opportunity in their life." The 2012 Trevecca Nazarene men's soccer team attained its most wins (9) in four seasons as the team started hot, winning six of its first eight matches before closing the year at 9-9.

The Trojans, competing in their first season in the Great Midwest Athletic Conference, went 1-2 during the regular season with their first-ever conference win on September 11 against Kentucky Wesleyan by a 3-2 count. Trevecca men's soccer team closed its year with a tough, hard-fought 3-2 loss to Cedarville in the G-MAC Tournament Semifinals.

The members of the women's soccer team had much to be happy about their 2012-2013 season. "We had a much more successful season in terms of wins or losses," explained Coach Brett Armstrong. "I think this season set a new standard for the program. It showed what this team is all about—that the women on this team can be successful in the conference and compete in a national level. From now on, we will expect to perform up to this season's standard."

Armstrong added, "We talk a lot about the fact that what's going on here is bigger than soccer. I tell the women that I want soccer to be their favorite part of their Trevecca experience—but only a part of their Trevecca experience. I want them plugged into their academics, go on mission trips, and be involved in groups of their majors. I

want them involved in clubs around campus. I want them to be active members of the larger campus community as well.

"This year we had a bunch of girls who loved being here and who loved playing together. That kind of big picture perspective takes some pressure off the smaller group dynamics."

In the greatest season in the program's 13-year history, the Trevecca women's soccer team won a school-record 16 matches, captured the inaugural Great Midwest Athletic Conference regular season and conference tournament titles, won the NCCAA Mid-East Region, and placed fourth nationally at the NCCAA Championships in Kissimmee, Florida. TNU ranked first in the G-MAC in goals allowed (14), shutouts (15) and GAA (0.57). The Trojans' offense had 15 players score goals this season while totaling a G-MAC-best 47 goals. TNU also assisted 31 times, tops in the conference.

Head Coach Brett Armstrong was named the G-MAC and Mid-East Region Coach of the Year.

Volleyball

The Trevecca volleyball team completed its first season in the Great Midwest Athletic Conference with a runner-up finish, won 23 matches, the second-highest total in coach Jayme Crowley's tenure, and placed several individuals on the all-conference and NCCAA Mid-East Region Teams.

Trevecca's women started the season 6-0, including a 3-1 win over No. 25 (NAIA) Freed-Hardeman. Following the hot start, the Trojans hit the road September 14 to 29. The women went 4-8 in that span, facing off against some of the best teams in the NAIA. In the G-MAC Volleyball Tournament, Trevecca rallied to defeat Urbana University in five sets before falling in a tightly contested championship match against host school Cedarville University. As a team, the Trojans led the G-MAC in digs (17.11 p/s) and were second in service aces (2.34 p/s), blocks (1.45 p/s), kills (11.65 p/s), assists (10.65 p/s), opponent hitting percentage (.173), and hitting percentage (.191).

The 2013 Trojans have the chance to be even better in coach Crowley's sixth season and second year in the G-MAC.


Women's Basketball







As TNU's athletic program makes its transition from the NAIA to NCAA Div. II, the Lady Trojan golf team experienced a year of transition as well in 2012-13.








